

# HUNGARIAN VIZSLA CLUB OF NSW INC. POINTSCORE COMPETITION RULES

## ROZSDA CATHARINA MEMORIAL TROPHY RULES

**Sponsored by the HVCNSW Inc for the Best Dog and Best Bitch in Australia**

1. This competition is open to all Hungarian Vizslas living in Australia.
2. The winners will be the dog and bitch with the highest total from up to ten (10) CC's (Best in Group and Best of Breed wins not to count) between 1<sup>st</sup> July and 30<sup>th</sup> June each year.
3. Higher CC's may replace lower ones as they are gained.
4. Results, giving date, show, judge, owner, dog's name and CC points awarded according to Vizslas of the same sex defeated are to reach the Pointscore Keeper within one month of the show.
5. Best in Group & Best in Show wins will not count - only Vizslas of the same sex defeated.
6. Best Dog and Best Bitch at Open shows conducted by affiliated Australian Hungarian Vizsla Clubs may also be counted. Full results showing the number of Vizslas present must be sent in place of a Challenge Certificate.  
*N.B. Open Shows have been included due to the large numbers of Vizslas shown at these. A win at an Open show should be of some significance within the breed.*
7. Best of Breed Challenge Certificate winners should supply a copy of the marked catalogue or full results so that the number of Vizslas of the same sex defeated can be counted. Any person sending a Best of Breed Certificate with no accompanying results shall only have 6 points recorded. So please, send in your full results!
8. Closing date will be 14<sup>th</sup> July each year.

## KIAI MEMORIAL TROPHY RULES

**Sponsored by the HVCNSW Inc. in memory of Ch. Aranyoz Gyors Galen AD NRD RRD ('Kiai')**

1. This competition is open to all main and limited registered Hungarian Vizslas living in Australia.
2. Owners may submit qualifying scores from ANKC Agility and Jumping trials conducted between 1<sup>st</sup> July and 30<sup>th</sup> June each year.
3. Points are calculated based on time under SCT, and a weighting applied according to the class entered.

### **Novice** class

will be calculated as SCT less course time.

### **Excellent** class

will be calculated as SCT less course time x 1.25.

### **Masters** and **Open** class

will be calculated as SCT less course time x 1.5.

For example; SCT = 60 secs. Course time = 45 secs.

In Novice class, the score is 60-45 = 15 points

In Masters class the score is (60-45) x 1.5 = 22.5 points, etc.

4. The highest total of points from the 5 best scores are included.
5. Higher scores may replace lower ones.
6. Details giving trial, class, judge, qualifying time, SCT, course length, owner and dog's name to reach the Pointscore Keeper within one month of the trial.
7. Closing date will be 14<sup>th</sup> July each year.

## THE NIZMO MEMORIAL TROPHY RULES

**Perpetual shield donated by Anne Salisbury for the Best HVCNSW Member's Obedience Dog**

1. The competition will be open to Main or Limited Register Hungarian Vizslas owned by members of the HVCNSW Inc.
2. Members may submit qualifying scores, and the winner will be the dog with the highest total of three scores from regular obedience classes gained between 1<sup>st</sup> July and 30<sup>th</sup> June each year.
3. Results may be replaced with higher scores throughout the year.
4. In the event of a tie, the count will include the next highest score submitted.
5. Scores to reach the Pointscore Keeper within one month of the trial.
6. Copies of qualifying certificates will be required from the top scoring (winning) dog.
7. Closing date will be 14<sup>th</sup> July each year.

## THE HANAFOR FIELD TRIAL TROPHY RULES

Rules and Scoring System for calendar year (1<sup>st</sup> January - 31<sup>st</sup> December)

The competition is open to all Hungarian Vizslas and Hungarian Wirehaired Vizslas living in Australia and is to be awarded to the Vizsla Dog or Bitch that earns the greatest number of points in Utility Field Trials for the current year.

### Allocation of points

| Utility Field Trials points schedule | 1 <sup>st</sup> | 2 <sup>nd</sup> | 3 <sup>rd</sup> placing |
|--------------------------------------|-----------------|-----------------|-------------------------|
| Novice Stake                         | 4               | 3               | 2 points                |
| Open/All Age Stake                   | 7               | 6               | 5 points                |
| Championship                         | 10              | 9               | 8 points                |

Results to be sent to the Pointscore Keeper within one month of the trial.

PLEASE NOTE: Trophies will only be awarded to dogs that score a minimum of seven (7) points

## THE HANAFOR RETRIEVING TRIAL TROPHY RULES

Rules and Scoring System for calendar year (1<sup>st</sup> January - 31<sup>st</sup> December)

The competition is open to all Hungarian Vizslas and Hungarian Wirehaired Vizslas living in Australia and is to be awarded to the Vizsla Dog or Bitch that earns the greatest number of points in Non-Slip Retrieving Trials for the current year.

### Allocation of Points

| Non-Slip Retrieving Trials points schedule | 1 <sup>st</sup> | 2 <sup>nd</sup> | 3 <sup>rd</sup> placing |
|--|-----------------|-----------------|-------------------------|
| Beginners Test                             | 2               | 1 point         | --                      |
| Novice Stake                               | 4               | 3               | 2 points                |
| Restricted Stake                           | 6               | 5               | 4 points                |
| All Age/Open Stake                         | 8               | 7               | 6 points                |
| Championship Stake                         | 10              | 9               | 8 points                |

Results to be sent to the Pointscore Keeper within one month of the Trial.

PLEASE NOTE: Trophies will only be awarded to dogs that score a minimum of seven (7) points.

**Note: Both these trophies are open to registered Hungarian Vizslas and Hungarian Wirehaired Vizslas.**

## THE HVCNSW INC. TRACKING POINTSCORE: 'THE WICK' RULES

Shield donated by Jo Carter for the top scoring tracking Vizsla

*Please note that in consultation with Jo Carter, the Committee has implemented amendments to the rules of this competition. The aim has always been to highlight the importance of participation in the HVC NSW's annual tracking trial. By adding a 'weighting' to results from that trial, it acknowledges the extra load on members who are trialling their own dogs as well as stewarding at this trial. It has however also removed the mandatory requirement for entry at the HVC NSW's trial, an important consideration in any year when the club has insufficient entries to run the event.*

First presented in 2005, The Wick perpetual trophy is donated by Jo Carter in honour of Tri Champion Hanafor Miss Wickford. The Pointscore Keeper will be Karyn Orzeszko. Scores must be submitted within one month of the relevant trial. (Please submit final scores by October 5<sup>th</sup>). Copies of the qualifying certificates may be required from the top scoring (winning) dog.

Open to Main and Limited Register Hungarian Vizslas owned by HVCNSW members who submit their dog's scores to the Pointscore Keeper.

Submissions can include all graded tracks and the winner will be the dog that attains the most points based on the following: Fail = 0 Pass = 1 Good = 2 Very Good = 3 Excellent = 4

Dogs that have trialled at a Hungarian Vizsla Club of NSW Tracking Trial will be awarded a bonus point in the year that they compete at that trial. Scores from passes obtained at the Hungarian Vizsla Club of NSW Tracking Trial will earn a 10% bonus/loading on the grading received - ie Pass = 1.1; Good = 2.2; Very good = 3.3; Excellent = 4.4

Dogs must be handled by their owners. If there is a tie, the final result will be decided by a countback based on the most number of Excellent scores, then the most Very Good scores, etc.

The competition will run from January 1<sup>st</sup> to October 1<sup>st</sup> each year, and the trophy will be presented at the October Championship Show and Obedience Trial.
